
## Business News

**We are delighted to see that Broanmain has continued to see a steady growth, with a 14% growth in turnover being reported for this year alone.**

This reflects the results of a recent BPF survey, which demonstrates a growing optimism amongst the UK Plastics Industry, who are confident of growing sales over the next year.

This growth is great news for Broanmain, as it allows us to step up our investment programme, which is now more crucial than ever.

Improvements in our efficiencies are essential if we are to maintain a competitive place in our market. This is one of the challenges we are experiencing, due to the current economic climate, which has led to the increase in raw material prices. In the first instance, this coming year will see us invest in new cranes, conveyors and hopper loaders. Further down the pipeline, we will invest in new sorting systems, dosing units and layout changes.




# Tooling



## Tooling Maintenance/Service

Recently, Wilf and Alan took a trip to Hong Kong and Shenzhen, in China, to visit both our existing tooling partners and to investigate relationships with new suppliers.



This particular visit was prompted by the award of a large tooling contract, for which it was necessary to see some of the tool work in production.

It was a great opportunity to further streamline the existing relationship, and to ensure that the tooling that we contract to our Chinese partners for manufacturing meets the standards that our mould shop needs in order to run them effectively and efficiently.

Our process, when placing tooling in China, requires our specification checklist to be submitted. Alan then follows the manufacture timeframes through with our partners on a weekly basis, feeding back to customers as the job progresses.



We now offer a standard maintenance/service for our customers' tools. After an agreed timescale/cycle count, the tool is stripped, cleaned, polished and assessed for potential damage that may occur over the next period. This will provide our customers with a report on the status of the tool, and should enable us to predict where there might be problems during the next run.

By conducting these vital assessments, it ensures that when a tool goes into the press it can run quickly and effectively, without quality issues or breakdowns. Much of the tooling we hold at Broanmain is over 20 years old, and this new offer provides our customers with the opportunity to keep their tooling in better working order, as well as providing them with a service report.
